

Course:	Mechanical Engineering Services – C&G NVQ Level 2 in Plumbing
This course is for:	Skilled operatives who are involved in the installation hot and cold water services, heating and draining systems in the commercial or domestic sector wishing to attain a nationally recognised qualification. The qualification is recognised by both employers and clients involved in this type of work in the construction and allied industries.
Employer benefits:	Employees will develop increased confidence and be able to perform to the highest standards in the construction industry
Length of course:	This course will run for 6 to 9 months.
Mandatory units:	Maintain the safe working environment when undertaking plumbing work activities. Maintain effective plumbing working relationships. Contribute to the improvement of the plumbing work environment. Install non complex plumbing systems and components. De-commission non complex plumbing systems. Maintain non complex plumbing systems and components.
Optional units:	There will be a range of optional units to choose from.
Location of study:	Workplace assessment

Entry requirements:	You must be at least 19 years of age and in employment as a plumber and have achieved City & Guilds Level 2 Certificate in Basic Plumbing Studies. You may be asked to take a literacy assessment.
Progression:	Skilled operatives could progress onto the Level 3 Certificate in Plumbing Studies, followed by the Level 3 Plumbing NVQ.
Cost:	This course is offered under the Train to Gain Programme. Training is free to individuals who meet the eligibility criteria for the Train to Gain programme. For eligibility criteria, telephone 020 7501 5313.

Award: Upon successful completion of this programme, learners will receive a full Level 2 NVQ in Plumbing, a vocationally recognised qualification.
