

Course:	Supporting Teaching & Learning in Schools: C&G NVQ Level 3
This course is for:	Employees working as experienced Teaching Assistants in a variety of situations/roles within the school sector with pupils aged 5-16 years will benefit from this national qualification.
Employer benefits:	Participants will further develop workplace skills relating to national occupational standards and their job role.
Length of course:	Depending on the experience of the employee, the course will run between 4 and 12 months. It will be based on an assessment model with underpinning knowledge workshops.
Mandatory Units:	Help to keep children safe. Support pupil's learning. Promote positive behaviour. Develop and promote positive relationships. Support the development and effectiveness of teams. Reflect on and develop practice.
Optional Units:	Students must complete four optional units.
Location of study:	This programme can be delivered in the workplace or at Lambeth College. Assessment is extremely flexible and is arranged in negotiation between the employer, employee and college assessor.
How to enrol:	Contact us for more information.
Entry requirements:	Employees should be working in a school. A letter will be required from the head teacher confirming their status and role and that they support the employee's attendance on the course. Candidates will be asked to take a literacy/numeracy assessment.
Progression:	Employees can develop their roles and responsibilities at work and progress onto Foundation Degree/HLTA status or other Level 4 courses.
Cost:	This course is offered under the Train to Gain programme. Training is free to employees who meet the eligibility criteria for the Train to Gain programme. For eligibility criteria, telephone 020 7501 5313.

Award: Upon successful completion, learners will receive a full NVQ Level 3.
